UPCOMING WORKSHOPS

All workshops will be held at Pauline's Place. *Check out the NEW Bulletin Board*. Sign up. All workshops require a deposit, usually \$10. (if needed full cost will be posted.) Workshops usually max out at 10 people. **Bring your lunch or a snack and have a fun day!**

- **Table Runner**, facilitated by Kim Clark. **March 10, 1 to 4pm**. This was postponed from February 3 and February 10.
- Paper Piecing, facilitated by Bonnie Greason. A spring-themed table runner. March 22, 9 to 4pm
- Twister Workshop -We had 5 people still interested, so we will run another one on Saturday, March 29 from 10 3 at Pauline's Place. If you are interested and haven't signed up there is room for 2 or 3 more. You must register for the workshop by calling Carol Seaman before March 15..
 - You have to have your squares sewn together in a top first with the border sewn on as well....No need to buy the Twister tools, the Guild has them and we will use them.
 - Community quilt (60 x 70) need 42 10" squares sewn together in 7 rows of 6 squares it's best to alternate light and dark squares for greater contrast in the finished quilt ...you need a border of 6 1/2" on all four sides and then we'll show you how to cut it with the Twister tool ...it is really amazing to see what
 - Baby quilt requires 36 6 1/2" blocks sewn 6 rows of 6 blocks with a 4" border...uses the midi twister
 - Placemats can be made with 15 5" blocks sewn in three rows of 5 and a 3 1/2" border....uses the Little Twister tool
- **Mesh Tote Bag** (Vinyl Screening Bag) Facilitated by Marianne Gilmore. **March 30, 10 to 2pm.** Check out the web-site calendar with a materials list and a photo of the bag.
- Beyond Beginners- This is a class we have run before and the participants had a lot of fun and got to try
 their hands at some more advanced techniques. The class will cover: templates, curved piecing, paper
 piecing, applique, set in seams
 - o There are small examples of each so you're not committing to an entire quilt of each just a "taste".
 - The final quilt is a queen size. The class will run every other week for 8 to 10 sessions depending on the choice of the participants. It will start on April 23 and cost \$75. The first session will be to go over the pattern and discuss material choices and tools.

Quilting for Peace, Making the World a Better Place One Stitch At A Time by Katherine Bell.

As crafters of all ages take to their sewing machines in unprecedented numbers, many of them join a movement to distribute hope and warmth to those in need through quilting. These are volunteers who have inherited a tradition of comfort and protest, and a belief that they can make the world a better place one stitch at a time.

Quilting for Peace profiles these quilters in more than 25 essays about individuals and organizations devoted to making quilts and other necessities for the needy. The efforts range from Newborns in Need, a group that makes clothing for premature babies at nearby hospitals; to Quilts of Valor, which makes quilts to honor wounded soldiers; to the Sleeping Bag Project, which distributes 100,000 homemade sleeping bags to the homeless every year. This book also includes 15 projects.

Spotlight on Maria Beckbergerby Ellen Crymble



Maria Beckberger was offered her dream job as the Family Studies Teacher at the former James A McGee school in Hanover. Slight hiccup when the Principal informed her that the funding to create a Family Studies classroom had not been granted for the coming semester. Did she speak French? Undaunted she taught French and Phys. Ed to Grade 7 and 8 students. Finally in 1975 funding was granted for the Family Studies room and she was privileged to have huge input in the design of that space. In addition to students from Hanover children were bused in from Ayton as well. Family Studies was a new course and most of the students were eager to learn new, practical techniques. She loved every minute of teaching Family studies and after 32 years retired from Teaching in 1998

Maria and her husband moved to Sauble Beach. She began walking in the winter in the Sauble Community Centre and noticed one day that a woman was staring at her. The woman came over to

speak with her and asked her what she was doing. She replied she was walking for her exercise. The woman asked if she wanted to meet the women who were quilting in the next room. She was immediately interested in what they were doing. The talked about the Bluewater Quilters' Guild and she joined the Guild in 1999. The woman she first met and who spoke to her about the Guild convinced her to submit her first quilt into the Quilt show and she was pleased win a ribbon. She never looked back after that. Friends and Guild members showed her new techniques and there wasn't a pattern or a technique that she wasn't willing to try. She saw a Dresden Plate pattern in McCalls Quilting magazine and thought why not try that? Her husband's aunt taught her how to quilt her pieced quilt. She still loves hand quilting.

Maria considers herself a "traditional Quilter". She has been sewing for 40 years and quilting still maintains her interest. She loves the support she has received from the Guild and encourages people to get involved. Take classes. Sit on the Executive. Maria has served on the Membership Committee and as Vice President, President and Past President. She encourages new members to take lots of classes and workshops. She loves scrappy quilts. She likes piecing and that original Dresden Plate pattern has been modernized by her and still remains a favourite. Quilting allows her to show her artistic ability and also make quilts for people she loves. Her family including nieces and nephews have all been the recipient of many quilts.

She encourages new quilters to ask questions. Make what you like in the colours that appeal to you. Go on quilt trips, shop hops. On Maria's bucket list is a trip to Houston Texas to attend the International World Quilt Show. She is always inspired by the work of quilters from other countries. Maria's Father taught her how to cross stitch when she was young. Maria belongs to the Creative Stitchers group at the Sauble Community Centre. This group works on a project every summer. They meet every Friday and in the summer their attendees increase in numbers. Teaching is in her blood and she has given workshops, done trunk shows and attended every workshop that is of interest.
