#### "Custom Edge to Edge Walking Foot Quilting"

Do you dislike burying threads? By quilting from edge to edge you will not have to bury any threads (unless your



bobbin runs out or your thread breaks). But just because you are quilting from edge to edge, doesn't mean you are limited to a boring quilt design or following the same pattern throughout the quilt. Join me in this class where you will be quilting a simple pixel quilt by using my Custom Edge-to-Edge Walking Foot Quilting technique to quilt your pixel quilt.

The book "Custom Edge-to-Edge Walking Foot Quilting" is required (cost approx. \$30.00) for this workshop. Please let Teresa know (by January 30, 2026) if you need to purchase a book for the workshop, as we may be able to get a volume discount if 10 people or more order the book.


### Tips, Tricks and Neat Ideas

We're glad to have new products to make the process more efficient, new books for reference and enjoyment, new classes to expand our horizons, new exhibits to inspire, and new friends to share our enthusiasm for all forms of needlework.

Perhaps, though, you're feeling frustrated because

Perhaps, though, you're feeling frustrated because you have more ideas than actual time for executing them. A few suggestions:



- Be realistic about what you can do. Choose a project that will give you pleasure, and work at it steadily.
- Make sure your work space is efficient and your equipment is up to date.
- Take advantage of small blocks of time and you'll be surprised at how much can be done.

Rhonda Watson's 10 commandments were first printed in *Sew News* magazine:

- 1. Thou shalt put away no ironing board before its time.
- 2. Thou shalt not expect meals, clean laundry, or a sparkling clean house when sewing calls.
- 3. Thou shalt walk around this room as if treading on needles and pins.
- 4. Thou shalt not use my fabric shears.
- 5. Thou shalt not covet my sewing machine.
- 6. Thou shalt stick no unthreaded needles in the pin-cushion.
- 7. Thou shalt always remember a stitch in time saves nine.
- 8. Thou shalt not touch my organized mess.
- 9. Thou shalt remember that each item sewn is stitched with love and care.
- 10. Thou shalt praise God often for all creative talents.
