
Aisha currently lives in Miramichi, New Brunswick. This presentation will be recorded and available in the members section of our website for 2 weeks only for the use of our members.

Using the Sue Spargo Embroidery Techniques, Trina will be teaching you the stitches needed to create a Stitch Sampler – check out the photos, they speak for themselves.

Seasonal Block of the Month 2022-2023 - ... It's not too late to start!

We hope everyone is having a chance to catch up with the block so far. At the December meeting, we made available the patterns for December through to March to cover the meetings that will be held on Zoom. If you did not get a chance to get the instruction sheets, please see the guild website and look under the 'Members only' and then 'OQG Challenges' heading. You will find the pdf copies of the instruction sheets there for the past months blocks.

Remember that for December there was a choice of two blocks but you just need to make one.

Your blocks will be 12" blocks (Finished size) (12.5 inches unfinished). Blocks will be constructed using various techniques including paper piecing, applique and traditional piecing. As a reminder, we are estimating 2 metres of background fabric for all the blocks, if you would like to have a consistent background. More would be needed for sashing and/or borders.

Member Challenges

#1 Star Challenge.

The quilt can be no smaller then 54" X 72".

When looking at the quilt you can easily see 1 or more stars.



#2 "What is in your Garden" Must be a quilt with a hanging sleeve (top, batting and backing, quilted however you like)



Outside dimension can be no larger the 72 inches. You can add embellishments, it can be bedazzled, coloured, whatever you like. Finally, we would like to have a few door prizes to be drawn each day at the show. Typically we have approached local businesses and our show vendors for these items. The Committee feels that as businesses recover from the affects of COVID on their bottom line, we would rather not approach them for a donation.
