

After having to cancel the 2021 Quilt Show, we are so please to say that once again, it's time to think ahead in preparation for our next Quilt Show Boutique.

As you look around your sewing rooms, you may find a few items you no longer need. The Quilt Show Boutique could benefit from your surplus!

The following are a few suggestions of what we are looking for as donations:

- -- Batting and Fabric of all sizes (scrap pieces are to be a usable size)
- Flannel .... Panels ....
- 4, 5, or 6" squares (regular cottons and batiks) .... 2.5" strips .... etc.
- Fully or partially completed projects or quilt tops (including pattern or instructions).

<u>Please bring in the above items by April 21, 2023</u> and place them in the bins under table between the library shelves. This is for **donated items only**, and will allow the committee time to sort through the items and organize them accordingly.

We will again have a section for gently used sewing and quilting items or tools, books, magazines, and patterns. These can be for donation or for sale by consignment.

We ask that you set these items aside and bring them to Embro on Mon., May 8 from noon – 6:00pm when you drop off your quilts for the show.

■ Please see the attached Vendor Inventory sheet where you can log these items along with any other sewing/quilting related items you may wish to sell.

As an alternative to plastic bags, fabric bags sewn by Guild members were provided for Boutique purchases at our last quilt show. Patrons were very pleased to have the bags as an extra bonus, and the goal of reducing the use of plastic was accomplished in style!

If you have some fabric in your stash that no longer suits your fancy, please consider making up a few quick bags for the Boutique.

We would like to have 2 sizes this time; 8" x 12" and 14" x 17". A simple rectangle with finished edges and handles would be great! Both sizes will hold books or magazines along with other items.

Your support of the last Boutique produced amazing results, and we hope we can count on your continued enthusiasm this time to make it another success!

- Food items teas, coffees, chocolate, candies


- Novels in excellent shape
