


#### **Knots and Patches**

It briefly looked like Christmas last week and I enjoyed the view when I walked out the door. It was so beautiful and I really missed not having snow in December. But the daffodils survived and are blooming steadily with the tulips not far behind. Spring has arrived and, as this is the first year I can do this, garden planning is underway.

For some time now I have been collecting selvedges ('self' edges – aka selvages). These are the sides of fabric where the edge is turned back as it returns through the shed during weaving. The shed is the temporary separation between the upper and lower yarns. Selvedges run parallel to the lengthwise grain and they keep the fabric from unravelling as they are much tighter that the fabric itself. You are usually advised to cut them off before using the fabric for clothing or quilts.



Fabric manufacturers have several options when they create their yardage. As in the illustration at left, they can have 'normal bound' or 'fringe' selvedges. Other methods include fused, tucked, plain tape and split.

Do you trim the selvedge from the fabric before you cut pieces for quilts? There is no hard and fast rule. It is a personal preference. I usually leave the selvedges on when I piece backings or in case I need an extra 1/8" to make the size I need for a quilt.

There are times when I cut the selvedge off, leaving an extra 3/4" of the fabric. These are for my friends who use them to create all sorts of wonderful items - hats, quilts, sewing machine covers, and bags, to name a few.

The selvedge usually has information about the fabric company and the fabric line. You will also notice the coloured 'dots'. Each dot or registration mark is one screen used to print the fabric. They are also very helpful when you want to purchase fabric to coordinate.

What is really interesting is that manufacturers climbed aboard the selvedge "train" and have created selvedges that are unique in their own right. Not only will you find the fabric information but the colour 'dots' will became trains, trees, or trucks. Sometimes words or sayings will be incorporated into the selvedge. **Chris Lynn Kirsch** wrote a blog "Selvedge Colors" on October 25, 2020, exploring the selvedges we find on fabric (**chrisquilts.net** – go to the archives).

So check out your recent fabric purchases or the bolts at the quilt store! It wouldn't be the first time someone bought a yard of fabric just for the selvedge! (cont'd on next page)




I use selvedges when I am making postcards. Please note the Big Dipper "Ursa Major" in the upper right hand corner of the polar bear postcard!



#### SNIPPETS FROM OUR PAST

**1992/1993 (134 members)** (cont'd from March issue)

**Rosemary Makhan** was the 1993 recipient of the CQA/ACC Teacher of the Year award! It was decided that, to save mailing costs, the newsletter would be now available for pick up at the monthly guild meeting.



Attendance at the 1993 Quilt Show (fifteenth) was 1350.

As our guild had grown bigger than the current location could comfortably handle, it was time to find a new location. In January it was announced that the guild would move to the **Burlington Cultural Centre** (Lakeshore Rd.) in September with a change to Tuesday nights. This decision was not made lightly, and the vote was a close one. It definitely was not without some criticism. Some members were not happy about travelling to Burlington while others were glad to have it closer to home. A suggestion was made to have two chapters of the Halton Guild, one to meet in Oakville and one in Burlington. Some members even felt that its growth had led the guild to lose some of its friendliness, so perhaps the move would allow us to get back to smaller groups and better know our members.

#### 1993/1994 (157 members)

A "Bell Ringer Meeting" (six demonstrations) started off the new guild year in the new location.

Members **Rosemary Makhan** and **Ruth Landon** organized a pay-as-you go monthly meeting at the Central Baptist Church in Oakville to work on cuddle quilts for families in the Halton Women's Place.

The 92/93 **Quilt Block Lottery** was a success, raising monies for the Speaker Fund, and so plans were made to continue it. Plans were also made for a second Musical Quilt (group quilt).

In March the guild held a **UFO Sale**, in which members brought unfinished items to sell!

Guild members will travel again to Lancaster for the Quilter's Heritage Celebration - a four day trip! Plans began for next year's **Quilt Show** to be held at Mainway Recreation Centre in spring 1995.

#### 1994/1995 (136 members)

Over the summer members helped with quilt displays at the Waterfront Festival, Country Quilt Fest, Senior Days and the CNE. This was organized by the **Volunteer Liaison** person. (Hmmm ... a "new" position for our guild executive?)

Workshops continued to be offered at both the Oakville and Burlington locations.

A new feature in the newsletter was **Teacher's Corner** so that members would get to know more about the workshop teachers. Not surprisingly, the first one to be featured was **Rosemary Makhan! Louise Giroud** and **Carol Goddu** were also featured.

It was decided to print the Block of the Month instructions each month in the newsletter.

Members were eager to sign up for the first annual Mystery Quilt!

In December guild members had the option of participating in an Ornament Exchange.

The guild project was <u>Jacob's Ladder and Fan</u>, and would be the Raffle Quilt for the Quilt Show. (*I am hoping to find a photo for the May newsletter.*) The draw for the <u>Musical Quilt</u> at the 1993 Quilt Show had raised \$1605. These raffles were a way to offset a growing budget, and would be used toward expenses for guest speakers and cuddle quilt supplies. It was hoped to display the quilt at various locations ahead of time (*What a great way to advertise the Quilt Show and sell more tickets!*)

The name of the upcoming Quilt Show is "New Beginnings / New Horizons". It was planned to have all the entrants for the HQG Challenge (a wall-hanging) displayed at the Quilt Show!

It appears that the guild will be on the move again ... but I've run out of room again, so next month!

#### **Block of the Month**

#### Sheila Keating, Cheryl Griffin and Barbara Laycock



MAY - FLUTTERBY (11 1/2" unfinished block)

#### **Cut**

4 - 6" multi-coloured squares for wings

8 - 2 ½" white squares

1 - 9" x 1 ½" strip to match darker colour of wings or black for body

2 - 1 1/2" X 2" strips of white

#### <u>Assembly</u>

- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each 2 ½" square.
- Snowball 2 of these squares diagonally on each 6" square.
- Press, making sure of good coverage, and then cut off extra fabric.
- Sew left side squares together, then right side squares, matching snowballs on edge of both sides.
- Sew the 2 small white strips to each end of the body strip.
- Sew the left and right wing units to each side of the body unit, making sure the 2" white strip matches evenly.
- This will be the top of the flutterby.
- Square up to an 11 ½" block.

#### ON BUYING FABRIC

- 1. If you are adding to your collection, 1/2 m. will do.
- 2. If you like the fabric for a quilt, buy 1 1/2 m.
- If you like the fabric for a large quilt with borders, buy 1 1/2 m.
- 4. If you walk around the store hugging it, buy at least 6 m. OR the whole bolt!
