We hope to start another top with a different block in October – we only had 6 sewers and they accomplished 42 blocks in 3 hours!!

**3 Yard Quilts** - We will have another 3 yard quilt workshop in the spring as well as another Twister quilt workshop. Both are great quilts for Beginners.

#### Health Link with the Bluewater Quilters' Guild

On **Friday Nov 7 (1:15 pm-1:45 pm) Carol Seaman and Bonnie Greason** will participate in a Roger's TV program called <u>Health Link</u>. Health Link explores healthy living in Grey and Bruce Counties. Host Carol Merton will have a conversation with Bonnie and Carol to learn about the work of the Bluewater Quilters' Guild and how it relates to the health of the community at large and of Guild members specifically. After the episode, it will appear on the <u>Health Link</u> page as a YouTube link, so be sure to check it out.

The Guild's work in creating comfort quilts for people having cancer treatment and fidget/sensory quilts for people with sensory processing disorders/challenges and dementia have obvious health benefits such as providing emotional comfort and a sensory and therapeutic tool to help busy hands and calm a person.

If you love quilting, you have likely experienced the "positive rush" and heightened sense of wellbeing that comes with it. A blog from Grace Company, called "Quilting for Wellness" describes the therapeutic health benefits of quilting as:

- Reducing stress and anxiety: the repetitive motions of quilting can calm the mind and body and provide a healthy way to cope with difficult emotions
- **Boosting mood:** Completing a quilt or other project can increase a sense of accomplishment and boost mood and self-esteem.

- Improving Focus and Concentration: Quilting requires focus and attention to detail which can improve concentration and cognitive function

### **Spotlight on Michelle McCutcheon** ....by Ellen Crymble



The Bluewater Quilters' Guild is so fortunate to have as one of our Zoom Co-ordinators to handle notification of meetings, passwords to Zoom meetings and her tech expertise. Tracey Ward is the other Zoom Co-ordinator and you can thank both of them for keeping us all technically up to date.

A nurse by profession Michelle decided to move into the tech world of health care and joined the Waterloo Health Network to work on their computer system. She moved to Grey County approximately 3 years ago and her job allowed her to work from home. Home is just NW of Owen Sound half way to Wiarton. She joined the Bluewater Guild in 2024 so welcome Michelle

When the beginner quilting course was offered Michelle decided to sign up even though she had an extensive sewing background and was familiar with quilting. She started quilting in her 30's and began sewing baby quilts, rag quilts and lap quilts.

They were a manageable size and with a full time job it was something! she could do whenever she had spare time. In the summer of 2024 an opportunity came up to buy a used long arm from a friend's mother. It opened up a whole new world for her and she just fell in love with longarming. She is self-taught and has offered to quilt many flimsies for Community Quilts. Her long arm machine is computerized and it is her new favourite sewing device.

Michelle considers herself a self taught sewer, piecer and quilter. She has learned a lot from videos on line and would encourage new quilters to seek out those instructions as she found them very helpful. Her exposure to other quilters has sparked her interest in learning more about applique and art quilting. She likes a new challenge and likes to learn a new skill when she chooses a new quilt pattern. When she saw the circle quilt pattern (see photo below) she couldn't wait to try it. Those of us who saw it at the Sept. meeting were wowed by the colour palette and the precision that was involved in this pattern. What a showstopper Michelle.

Michelle took a course on colour last fall and finds it easier now to choose fabrics for her patterns and understand colour theory. She encourages new quilters to try new things, get involved, join a special interest group, and sign up for a course.

While Michelle did not learn quilting from her aunt Pauline McCutcheon (the Guild named Pauline's Place after Michelle's Aunt Pauline), she did inherit her aunt's sewing machine so you just know good things are going to come from that connection. Michelle enjoys the show and share portion of our meetings whether in person or on line because seeing what others make inspires her and shows her new techniques and new information. She found the talk on batting to be eye opening. So much to learn in the quilting world. She is going to tackle a Barn Star Sampler quilt. She found the book on our Library and also found it on Amazon.

So when you see Michelle at our meetings with that great smile welcome her as a relatively new member and the person who will help you solve your technical problems when you are having trouble logging onto a meeting. Welcome.
